A large part of this document involves suggestions for how to replace complex language. As a personal rule, I try not to make critiques without offering a solution. But, it may not be the best solution!



We want to make sure the site is usable up to 200% zoom.




Is it Operable?



Missing navigation focus indicator


For users who don't use a mouse, we want some indicator of where their focus is. An easy test is to press "Tab" a bunch of times to see if you can keep track.
